Significance of the Sign of the Cross

The sign of the cross is a very ancient practice and prayer. We don't have any indication of it in Scripture, but St. Basil in the fourth century said that we learned the sign from the time of the apostles and that it was administered in baptisms. Some scholars interpret St. Paul's saying that he bears the marks of Christ on his body, in Galatians 6:17, as his referring to the sign of the cross. Tertullian said that Christians at all times should mark their foreheads with the sign of the cross. I can imagine that Christians would make a little sign of the cross with their thumb and forefinger on their foreheads, to remind themselves that they were living a life for Christ.

The sign of the cross is: a confession of faith; a renewal of baptism; a mark of discipleship; an acceptance of suffering; a defense against the devil; and a victory over self-indulgence.

When you make the sign, you are professing a mini version of the creed - you are professing your belief in the Father, and in the Son and in the Holy Spirit. When you say the words and pray in someone's name you are declaring their presence and coming into their presence-that's how a name is used in Scripture. As a sacramental, it's a renewal of the sacrament of baptism; when you make it you say again, in effect, "I died with Christ and rose to new life." The sign of the cross in baptism is like a Christian circumcision, which united Gentile converts to the Jewish nation.

The sign links you to the body of Christ, and when you make it you remember your joining to the body with Christ as the head.

The sign of the cross is a mark of discipleship. Jesus says in Luke 9:23, "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me." The word that the Fathers of the Church used for the sign of the cross is a Greek word that is the same as what a slave owner put on a slave, a shepherd put on a sheep and a general put on a soldier - it's a declaration that I belong to Christ. Self-denial is not just giving up little things; to be a disciple you are under Christ's leadership and you don't belong to yourself. By doing the sign of the cross, you're saying to the Lord, "I want to obey you; I belong to you. You direct all my decisions. I will always be obedient to God's law, Christ's teachings and the Church.

From the Diocesan Marriage Office

Are you aware that when a Catholic gets married, he or she must be married in front of a Catholic priest (deacon or bishop) and two witnesses? This is called the Form of Marriage. If a Catholic does not get married in this way it is not recognized by the Church (unless a Dispensation from Form was requested of the local bishop through the pastor) and thus the Catholic party is to refrain from receiving the Eucharist until such time as this has been rectified. You see, it has nothing to do with the location of the wedding but with the witnesses involved. Originally, this was done to provide for the safety of women who were being abandoned by men who refused to recognize their marriages. Today, while safety is no longer an issue, the law still pertains. It is important to note that non Catholic marriages performed in any legal manner are considered binding by the Church if the parties are free to marry.

If you are in a situation where you believe your marriage might not be presently recognized by the Church, give your pastor a shout and he will work things out with you. If you have not been married previously to another person then there is no problem in solving this difficulty. If you have been previously married, (or your spouse has been previously married) then he will simply have to work a little harder to resolve the situation. <u>Can you change godparents after a baptism?</u> SEPT. 12, 2016

Here's part of an e-mail that arrived this morning:

My son was Baptized at the Church in 2015. We had initially chose the Godparents but there was a change in Godfather last minute. My brother (initial Godfather) did not attend the Baptism and ignored my request to show that day. Also ignored me for almost one year. My best friend stood in place that day, assuring us my son would have a Godfather present.

Luckily I have good friends who would do anything for me. My brother and I have reconciled from that day but if I may, I would like to request a new Baptism Certificate with the correct Godfather name on there. My brother could not make it because of money. He lives in Chicago. Even though I offered to split the cost. He chose to behave in an immature way by ignoring the Baptism, no call no show, after he agreed to be the Godfather. As a good Roman Catholic individual, I have forgiven him.

However, because of those circumstances, my wife and I have decided to have my best friend be Godfather. This would really mean a lot to us, especially my wife, if we could have a new Baptism Certificate.

Thank you in advance for taking the time to read this request.

Response:

This issue comes up a couple times a year.

Short answer: no can do

People don't quite realize that a godparent is more than a ceremonial role. It comes with responsibilities and expectations. And, in a way, it's similar to being the witness at a marriage. It's a matter of historical record. You can't change the name of your best man or maid of honor (or the priest or deacon who presided) after the fact. It is what it is. And there's really no canonical provision for this sort of thing anyway.

Three years ago, Michelle Arnold had this response over at **Catholic Answers:**

Because the godparent is an official witness to the baptism of the child, it is not an office for which a "replacement" can be made. It is not possible to go back and "redo" the sacrament of baptism, substituting in new and improved godparents. Once a choice is made, parents are stuck with that choice. For better or for worse, in sickness and in health, until death do you part.

Father Kenneth Doyle at CNS had **this advice** to someone in similar circumstances:

You are not allowed to change your daughter's godparents. They are the ones who served as official witnesses to her baptism and the ones who, at the time, along with the parents, asked to have the child baptized into the church. Their names are inscribed on your daughter's baptismal certificate and in the parish's baptismal registry, and history cannot be undone. However, you understand correctly the proper role of godparents, which is to assure the religious and spiritual

development of the child, particularly if anything should happen to the parents, and there are some options.

You could ask someone else to step into that role, perhaps a trusted friend or family member who might serve as an example of religious fidelity and help guide your daughter's growth as a Catholic.

Also, in a few years, your daughter will receive the sacrament of confirmation, and although the church's Code of Canon Law in No. 893.2 says that it is "desirable" to have the same sponsor as at baptism, it is not required.

So you could pick someone else as the confirmation sponsor. That new person would then become responsible for monitoring your daughter's religious development and, in many parishes, would attend confirmation preparation classes with your daughter. Best advice to people picking godparents for their children: choose wisely and carefully. Make it someone who can model the Catholic faith, and who is invested in the role—someone who will take it seriously and live it faithfully. I remember once asking my mother how they picked the man who was my godfather. "He was a good man, a good Catholic man," she said. And indeed he was.
