Who is a parishioner?

It is important to note that no one can belong to two or more parishes; yes, you can attend Mass at more than one parish but everyone must have their own "proper" parish. In olden days, one's proper parish was the one closest to you and "borders" were clearly established. Your pastor (and other priests in the parish under his authority) had spiritual responsibility for you and indeed for all people within the borders of the parish. These borders were set by the bishop when the parish was established.

Today there is more flexibility in that Catholics are able to choose their own parish provided that they are willing to commit to that parish but everyone must belong to a parish. We do not have "floaters." If you do not choose your parish then your territorial parish chooses you. It is much the same with the priesthood. Every priest must be under the jurisdiction of a bishop or a religious superior. A priest cannot roam the world pretending he is a free agent.

While it is possible to choose a parish, other than your territorial parish, those who do so must be willing to place themselves under the spiritual authority of their pastor. After all, someone has to be responsible for you spiritually and if you are dying, you will want a priest to be present to you. Belonging to a parish community allows you to know that your family members will be baptized, married and buried and celebrate other significant sacraments in a particular parish with your pastor as opposed to shopping around looking for the best deal in town. Membership in a parish brings with it certain

responsibilities and privileges. In terms of privileges I immediately think of those who wish to have school discounts (parish supporter). It seems somewhat

dishonest to want to receive a parish supporter discount if you do not attend that parish, do not contribute financially (according to ability) or contribute in any other way as a volunteer. And yet this seems to happen. I think it speaks profoundly to one's level of discipleship or lack thereof.

While many visit a parish or simply come to celebrate Mass and are certainly welcome, membership in a parish requires that the parishioner attends Mass on a regular basis, contributes financially according to his / her ability and participates in the life of the parish contributing in

different ways according to one's gifts. It means that one is willing to accept mail or email from the parish and also receives mail from the Bishop's office when such is warranted. It means that one is willing to be known although this might be somewhat difficult in a parish as large as the Cathedral. Having said all this, it is important to remember that those who once were active in the Church family but who have grown frail over the years or who are in poor health and thus no longer able to attend Mass because they are home bound or in nursing homes remain full members of the parish community. As once you came to see the Lord in his house, so now the Lord will come to visit you in your dwelling either in the person of the priest or someone who has been commissioned as an Extra-Ordinary Minister of Holy Communion.

If you are not yet registered as a parishioner, it is very easy to do so; simply contact the parish office via phone or email to register or complete a registration form (available in the Vestibule) and then keep your contact details updated as things change.




