

Legacies are a way of providing assurance that the parish has income or savings in the event of unforeseen emergencies.

The monthly 'Building Fund and Collection' pays for maintenance/replacement items.

Sacramental Information

Baptism: at Our Lady Queen of Peace you must call the office at least 3 months in advance to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. It is assumed that the family has Our Lady Queen of Peace parish connection and practices the faith by attending Sunday Mass on a weekly basis. You may meet with the Pastor and take the course even if your child has not yet been born. Parents are expected to participate in the Baptismal preparation. At least one Godparent or both must be baptized and confirmed and are practicing Catholics. Non-parishioners are required to have a Letter of Recommendation from your Pastor to have your child Baptized in our parish.

Marriage: at Our Lady Queen of Peace because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

<u>Funeral:</u> at Our Lady Queen of Peace individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

100 Year Loss

The "100 Years of Loss" curriculum from the Legacy of Hope Foundation (in partnership with the Aboriginal Healing Foundation) will be facilitated by Fr. Dean Henderson for non-Indigenous People. Fr. Dean, primarily through relationships with Yukon Tlingit, Vancouver Island Ahousaht, TS'ou-ke and Pacheedaht Peoples, is increasingly aware that non Aboriginal Canadians must learn the history of residential schools to better understand the need for our healing, and reconciliation with our brother and sister First Nation peoples.

Fr. Dean will also consider the written reflections of the residential school experience of two Catholic religious orders; one of which was submitted for the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

This short course will be awareness building through lessons from history, experiential exercises and will have the goal of motivating desire for friendship through healing, justice and reconciliation.

Registration will be required for non UVic/Camosun students and is limited.
