Masses Resuming

Mass registration is for Our Lady Queen of Peace parishioners only and not friends and others from other parishes. You may register for one Mass on Sat. or Sun. (not both)

To register for the weekend Mass please call 250-384-3884 or email office@qop.ca

Masses are at the following times:

Weekdays: Tuesday to Friday: 12:10 pm

Weekend: Saturdays at 5:00 pm or Sundays at 10:00 am

If you are registered for Mass and you do NOT show without giving us notice, your name will be removed from all future registrations.

All people must be registered for Mass. Your registration is not confirmed until you have received a reply to your email or your phone call. We need to know the names of everyone from your family who will be attending and not just the numbers. We cannot exceed 38 persons. You may bring your missalette/missal if you wish. None will be provided.

Deadlines for registering for Mass: Friday at 1:00 pm

No one will be admitted to Mass once the doors are closed. They will be locked. This will not prevent anyone inside from leaving should they so desire as they are all fire doors but it will prevent anyone from entering. We are bound to follow protocols and this is an important one as people cannot simply wander in at will.

Sacramental Information

Baptism: at Our Lady Queen of Peace you must call the office at least 3 months in advance to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. It is assumed that the family has Our Lady Queen of Peace parish connection and practices the faith by attending Sunday Mass on a weekly basis. You may meet with the Pastor and take the course even if your child has not yet been born. Parents are expected to participate in the Baptismal preparation. At least one Godparent or both must be baptized and confirmed and are practicing Catholics. Non-parishioners are required to have a Letter of Recommendation from your Pastor to have your child Baptized in our parish.

Marriage: at Our Lady Queen of Peace because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

<u>Funeral:</u> at Our Lady Queen of Peace individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

Re-opening our Church!

Re-opening our Church will look very different, due to the additional protocols and directives we are required to follow. Bishop Gary states that the dispensation from attending Mass given to all the Faithful of the Diocese of Victoria will remain during this phase. As such, if you are uncomfortable with coming to Mass, please stay at home.

The following MUST stay home for the sake of the wider community:

- •People infected with COVID-19 or who live with someone with COVID-19
- •People who have been exposed to someone with COVID-19
- •The sick, including those with even the slightest symptoms or feelings of sickness, especially if with upper respiratory or flu-like symptoms
- •Those who have recently travelled outside of Canada, the following are ENCOURAGED to stay home for the sake of the wider community
- •People who live with someone with upper respiratory or flu-like symptoms
- •People, especially the elderly, with underlying or compromised medical conditions
- •Family members who live with elderly people or those who are at risk
- •Those who feel that their age puts them on the vulnerable list

During this period, we are given the privilege of having Mass Groups of 38 attendees (including Fr. John), that are pre-registered it is imperative that we record exactly who attends each Mass Group. Please note that you may sign up for ONLY ONE Mass on the weekend. You will need to submit your name, quantity (number of family members attending), your phone number, your email address, and ensure ALL names of family members are listed. This will help us track and trace each parishioner in that particular "Group", should a breakout occur. While attending your selected Mass through this period.

Please advise the parish office if you would like to volunteer and commit as an usher, or help with the cleaning and sanitizing of the church after the Mass you attend.

When you arrive for Mass, please approach the usher at the entrance for your attendance to be recorded. You are welcome to wear a mask upon arriving for and during Mass. Your understanding in this matter is much appreciated.
