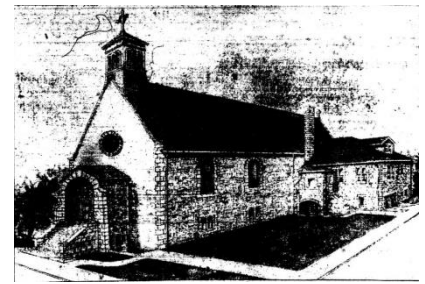

Sacramental Information

Baptism: at Our Lady Queen of Peace you must call the office at least 3 months in advance to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. It is assumed that the family has Our Lady Queen of Peace parish connection and practices the faith by attending Sunday Mass on a weekly basis. You may meet with the Pastor and take the course even if your child has not yet been born. **Parents are expected to participate in the Baptismal preparation.** At least one Godparent or both must be baptized and confirmed and are practicing Catholics. **Non-parishioners are required to have a Letter of Recommendation from your Pastor to have your child Baptized in our parish.**

Marriage: at Our Lady Queen of Peace because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: at Our Lady Queen of Peace individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

New lower age for BC Public Health Order mask mandate, and Music Ministry Covid-19 Prevention Plan

The B.C. government has released a new verbal Public Health Order on face coverings:

<https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/covid-19/info/restrictions#masks>

In accordance with this order, **we will now require face coverings for all people born in 2016 or earlier (ages 5 and up) for all activities in church buildings in the Diocese of Victoria, including worship services.** The Public Health Order lists a number of conditions under which a person is not required to wear a face covering. These exceptions must be respected, and compassion, good judgement, and pastoral sensitivity are encouraged.

Further, in consultation with the Diocesan Liturgical Commission and music ministers from parishes throughout our Diocese, a Music Ministry Covid-19 Prevention Plan has been developed. **The Diocese of Victoria requires singers and musicians to adhere to its policies for rehearsing and leading singing at church services.** The Prevention Plan may be found attached, or online at:

"Our Lady of Good Council"

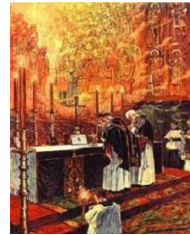

Remembering the faithful departed during November



We begin November with the celebration of the Solemnity of All Saints, a holy day honoring all those faithful souls in heaven. The following day we observe the Commemoration of All Souls. The celebration of Mass is the highest charitable act the church can perform for the dead. In addition, we can help the souls in purgatory through our prayers, sufferings and penances. All are done with the hope that these deeds will aid the poor souls in purgatory and help them to be united with the saints in heaven.

Plenary Indulgence:

Visit a Cemetery and Pray for the Dead

The Bible tells us that, "it is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins," (2 Maccabees 12:46) and especially in the month of November, the Catholic Church urges us to spend time in prayer for those who have gone before us. Prayer for the souls in Purgatory is a requirement of Christian charity, and it helps us to call to mind our own mortality.

The Church offers a special plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, on All Souls Day (Nov.2), but She also encourages us in a special way to continue to keep the Holy Souls in our prayers throughout the first week of November.

Why Should We Visit a Cemetery

to Pray for the Dead?



The Church offers an Indulgence for a Cemetery Visit that is available as a partial indulgence all year round, but from Nov. 1st through Nov. 8th, this indulgence is plenary. Like the All Souls Day indulgence, it is applicable only to the souls in Purgatory. As a plenary indulgence, it remits all punishment due to sin, which means that simply by performing the requirements of the indulgence, you can obtain the entrance into Heaven of a soul who is currently suffering in Purgatory.

This indulgence for a visit to a cemetery encourages us to spend even the briefest of moments in prayer for the dead in a location that reminds us that we, too, will someday need the prayers of the other members of the Communion of Saints—both those still living and those who have entered into eternal glory. For most of us, the indulgence for a cemetery visit takes only a few minutes, and yet it reaps immense spiritual benefit for the Holy Souls in Purgatory—and for us as well, since those souls whose suffering we ease will pray for us when they enter into Heaven.

What Must One Do to Obtain the Indulgence?

To obtain the plenary indulgence on Nov. 1- Nov. 8, we must receive Communion and sacramental Confession (and have no attachment to sin, even venial). Communion must be received each day we wish to gain the indulgence, but we only need to go to Confession once during the period. A good prayer to recite to earn the indulgence is Eternal Rest, though any formal or informal prayer for the dead will suffice. And, as with all plenary indulgences, we must pray for the intentions of the Holy Father (one Our Father and one Hail Mary) each day we perform the work of the indulgence.

The Work of the Indulgence

An indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The indulgence is plenary each day from the 1st to the 8th of Nov.; on other days of the year it is partial.



A Special Indulgence for the Holy Souls

November is the time in the Liturgical year when the Church calls us to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

With the feasts of All Saints and Holy Souls on the 1st and 2nd of Nov. respectively we are drawn to think about that eternal link that exists between us here on earth, the saints in heaven and those holy souls who are expiating their sins in purgatory.

The Church has always taught us, and the saints have reminded us, of the great relief that the souls in purgatory receive from our prayers. In the encyclical letter *Spe Salvi*, Pope Benedict XVI offered these encouraging words about praying for our departed loved ones, "...my prayer for another is not something extraneous to that person, something external, not even after death. In the interconnectedness of Being, my gratitude to the other—my

prayer for him—can play a small part in his purification. And for that there is no need to convert earthly time into God's time: in the communion of souls simple terrestrial time is superseded. It is never too late to touch the heart of another, nor is it ever in vain."

(Pope Benedict XVI, *Spe Salvi*, no 48)

It can be a very comforting practice for bereaved families to visit the cemetery to pray for their loved ones. However, it is even more comforting, as our faith teaches us, to believe that our loved ones are still with us and can be helped by our prayers to enter into the Eternal beatitude with the Lord. Therefore, in order to encourage the practice of praying for the dead, the Church has granted a plenary indulgence that can be applied to the souls in purgatory if the faithful make a visit to a cemetery to pray for the dead from the 1st Nov. until the 8th day of Nov. It can be applied to our loved ones or to a soul with no-one to pray for them. The indulgence can be gained on each day. To obtain the indulgence the usual conditions apply: the visitation to a cemetery or a Church where souls are buried, sacramental confession (within 7 days), Eucharistic communion, prayer for the Holy Father's intentions (Creed, Our Father, Hail Mary and a Glory be) and a detachment from all sins.

(cfr. Apostolic Constitution on Indulgences nos 7&8)

The receipt of a plenary indulgence means that the Holy Soul is freed from all the temporal punishment due to sin and as such can enter fully into heaven with the Lord. Therefore, it is a great grace to apply this indulgence to a departed loved one or even to someone who has no one to pray for them as you can already think of them enjoying the eternal beatitude with the Lord.
