Baptism: Call the office at least 3 months in advance to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. It is assumed that the family has Our Lady Queen of Peace parish connection and practices the faith by attending Sunday Mass on a weekly basis. EUCHARIST as Thanksgiving



We give many different names to the sacrament we celebrate when we gather before the altar each Sunday, each highlighting a different aspect: communion, the Lord's Supper, the breaking of bread, the holy sacrifice of the altar, and of course, Eucharist, among others. Why do we call it this, and where does this word come from?

In the ancient Middle East at the time of Jesus, the Jewish community normally communicated in Aramaic, a language related to Hebrew, although Greek had become the dominant language of education, business, and culture in that part of the world for several centuries by that point. In fact, the entire New Testament (except for possibly the Gospel of Matthew) was originally composed in Greek.

The word Eucharist comes to us from Greek, and it means "thanksgiving". It is composed of two parts: eu- which means "good" or "well", and charis, which is a little trickier to translate. It may mean "free gift", "favour", "generosity", or "grace". It is even related to the Greek word for "joy". So when we say Eucharist, we are acknowledging that this great sacrament, which makes Christ's sacrifice on the cross truly present before us, is a gift which he freely chooses to give to us, his beloved children, for our good.

At the same time, we are acknowledging that every good thing we have comes from God, and in celebrating the Eucharist, we offer him our sincere gratitude. As we read in the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

"The Eucharist is a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Father, a blessing by which the Church expresses her gratitude to God for all his benefits, for all that he has accomplished through creation, redemption, and sanctification. Eucharist means first of all 'thanksgiving'" [CCC 1360].

The various forms of the word Eucharist (translated as "giving thanks", "thanksgiving", or similar) appear in the New Testament a total of 54 times. The apostle St. Paul, while building up the small, emerging Christian communities, constantly speaks of giving thanks to God. A few samples:

• Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. [1 Thessalonians 5:16-18]

• Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. [Philippians 4:6-7]

• I always thank my God as I remember you in my prayers. [Philemon 1:4] As we celebrate the holiday of Thanksgiving this weekend, let us reflect and give thanks to the Father for blessing us abundantly with all the good things in our lives. And let us also remember every time we come to the Eucharist, the great thanksgiving, to approach with profound gratitude in our hearts. Matthew Orlowski
