Baptism at Our Lady Queen of Peace

To have your child Baptized at Our Lady Queen of Peace Church, you must call the office at least 3 months in advance to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. It is assumed that the family has Our Lady Queen of Peace parish connection and practices the faith by attending Sunday Mass on a weekly basis. You may meet with the Pastor and take the course even if your child has not yet been born. Parents are expected to participate in the preparation.

At least one Godparent or both must be baptized and confirmed and are practicing Catholics. Nonparishioners are required to have a Letter of Recommendation from your Pastor to have your child Baptized in our parish.

Brief History

The Statue of the Infant of Prague was presented as a gift to the parish of Our Lady Queen of Peace by the Rector. Fr. Jerome Moras, OCD of the Shrine of the Infant of Prague, the Czech Republic. With the permission of the Bishop of the Diocese of Victoria, the Statue was officially installed on August 30th, 2003 by Fr. Moras. Since that date, Our Lady Queen of Peace Church has been designated as an official site of the Shrine of the Infant of Jesus.

Devotion to the Divine Infant originated with the Carmelites in the city of Prague, at the beginning of the 17th Century. The Princess Polyxema received as a wedding gift, a statue of the Divine Infant, previously brought from Spain. After the death of her husband, the princess devoted herself to works of charity and was particularly helpful to the Carmelites saying; "give you what I prize most highly in the world; honour and respect the Child Jesus and you shall never be in want.'

However, during the war, the monastery was vandalized and the invaders seized the statue and threw it into a pile of rubbish. Seven years passed and the statue was forgotten until it was found broken and mutilated by Fr. Cyril, who previously had received spiritual help from the Divine Infant, The statue was restored by a benefactor and once more peace and properity returned to the Carmelites and an avalanche of miracles and divine favours occurred.

People come every Thursday to Our Lady Queen of Peace Church in Esquimalt and partake in devotions to the Infant Jesus, which are held after the 12:10pm Mass.

Being blessed with oil from the Shrine of Prague,

many people say they have received special graces and blessings through intercessions to the Divine Infant.

"The Little King has been enthroned as the Great King of the world to assist His subjects in their trials, difficulties and crosses. He who Himself has suffered so much, desires to assist those who come to Him. He wishes to attract all hearts to His own through the attractiveness and simplicity of His Divine Infancy."
