Development & Peace - A Voice for Justice

Throughout the Bible Jesus entreats us to "do unto others as we would have them do unto us", take care of the downtrodden (the good Samaritan) and know that "whatever you do to the least of these you do unto me". In other words work toward justice for all.

A Voice for Justice focuses on the action of Canadian mining companies operating in other countries whose operators respect neither the human rights of local communities nor the environment. Among other things, our Fall Action Campaign calls for the creation by the Government of Canada of an extractive sector ombudsperson mechanism in Canada that would provide for the independent investigation of complaints against mining companies operating in other countries.

Don't get me wrong. We are not asking the Canadian Mining Companies to STOP WORK, or GET OUT. At the moment the complaints of the people of the countries where many Canadian mining companies are excavating are not being heard.

In their poverty, neither their own governments nor the Canadian mining companies are paying any attention to the devastation being committed to the people in the vicinity.

The Fall Campaign promotes the belief that the Canadian government has a responsibility: to ensure the Canadian companies enter into a consultation process with the people in the locations they choose to operate in and that they ensure that some compensation for disruptions reaches the people being disrupted. "Mining companies certainly bring revenue to the state, but the communities do not benefit directly from the profits; instead, they fall deeper into poverty because they have problems with basic resources such as water and soil and they have to relocate."

Stay tuned for examples of problems that have arisen from situations where Canadian mining companies are operating.

Here is a reminder of a film looking at this very problem.

A Voice for Justice will be showing the film, **Defensora**, **at St. Joseph's Church**, **753 W. Burnside Rd.**, **7 pm. on Wed. Jan. 22**, **2014.** - A very powerful statement of the effect of a Canadian mining company on a Guatemalan village. Sponsored by Development and Peace and St. Joseph's Eco-Justice Committee.
