Hi Everyone. I want to tell you about the new informational campaign for Development & Peace. This year it is time to look at support of small farmers around the world and Ecological Justice.

Did you know that small, family farmers feed 70% of the world's population? This is remarkable when we think of the industry of farming!

Seeds are the valuables of farmers. Each farmer takes the best of his produce to save the seeds to plant the following year. Unfortunately, there is a move afoot to have big companies provide hybrid seeds (with assurances of purchase of production).

This change requires the farmers to **purchase** the hybrid **seeds**, purchase the **fertilizer** required to make these special seeds grow and **render useless the seeds from the produce** to ensure the farmer must purchase new seed the following year.

This may not sound all that bad, BUT: in a bad crop year, there will be little money left over to purchase the next years seeds and fertilizer; the farmer becomes beholden to the company and limited in his/her crop growth; the varieties of crop plants are lost over time. FACTS: There are more than **7,500** varieties of applies in the world; Canada produces **436** varieties of wheat; since 1970 **10,000** local varieties of rice seed have disappeared, replaced by industrial hybrid seeds.

Thanksgiving is fast approaching. I urge you to look to purchasing your dinner items from local farmers. Get the satisfaction of supporting food growth on Vancouver Island. Talk to the farmer when you are shopping. Then think beyond our island to how others are affected by local produce.
