Development & Peace – A Voice for Justice

I am glad you are interested enough to follow this campaign. Here are some examples of complaints that villagers report when Canadian mining companies set up shop:

Communities bemoan the lack of information provided by mining companies that promise benefits for their region yet fail to explain clearly all of the social and environmental impacts linked to mining. In addition, people complain about the manipulation to which they are being subjected eg. gifts in exchange for individuals supporting the mining project, threats to those who don't support; abruptly reporting a village will need to be relocated (without a relocation plan or clear information).

Mining companies certainly bring revenue to the "state", but the communities do not benefit directly from the profits; instead, they fall deeper into poverty because they have problems with basic resources such as water and soil, and they have to relocate.

Since the official launch of our campaign, 22 Canadian civil society organizations, who are also members of the Canadian Network on Corporate Accountability

(CNCA), have joined us in our mobilization to ensure that victims of abuse by Canadian extractive companies abroad have access to justice in Canada.
