'ASH WEDNESDAY'

Ash Wednesday, March 5, & Good Friday, April 18, are days of fast and abstinence throughout the universal church. Fridays of Lent are also compulsory days of abstinence throughout the universal church. In Canada, Catholics may substitute an act of charity in place of abstinence on Fridays. However, it is strongly encouraged that some form of penitential discipline be undertaken on a weekly basis.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is **observed by all 14 years of age and older.** On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

The mission will be for **3 evenings starting at 7:00pm on Tues. April 8th, and ending on Thurs. April 10th.** The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed during the Mission. The Noon Masses will continue as usual. Everyone is invited.



Development & Peace – A Voice for Justice I am glad you are interested enough to follow this campaign. Here are some examples of complaints that villagers report when Canadian mining companies set up shop: Communities bemoan the lack of information provided by mining companies that promise benefits for their region yet fail to explain clearly all of the social and environmental impacts linked to mining. In addition, people complain about the manipulation to which they are being subjected eg. gifts in exchange for individuals supporting the mining project, threats to those who don't support; abruptly reporting a village will need to be relocated (without a relocation plan or clear information). Mining companies certainly bring revenue to the "state", but the communities do not benefit directly from the profits; instead, they fall deeper into poverty because they have problems with basic resources such as water and soil, and they have to relocate. Since the official launch of our campaign, 22 Canadian civil society organizations, who are also members of the Canadian Network on Corporate Accountability (CNCA), have joined us in our mobilization to ensure that victims of abuse by Canadian extractive companies abroad have access to justice in Canada. Please don't hesitate to talk to your D. & P. representative, Margaret Varga, call 250-380-7355. Pope Francis reminds us of our **obligation** to engage our societies to be transformed to ones where all God's Creation has life with dignity. If the fruits of our or another society's social arrangements do not enable all within the society to have life with dignity we have an **obligation** to alleviate the symptoms while engaging the social arrangements to transform them. Each of us will meet this obligation in our own way. If you feel that the way for you to carry out God's will is to participate in the Voice of Justice campaign, please do the following: Accept a postcard (available at church on Feb. 22/23 to be sent to your MP; complete the postcard; and either send it in on your own, or return it to a box at each entrance of the church for Margaret to send them all at once.
