Deadline for Government Matching – On Sept. 12, 2015 the Government launched the Syria Emergency Relief Fund which will match individual's contributions to the humanitarian relief efforts. On January 7, 2016 The Honourable Marie-Claude Bibeau, Minister of International Development and La Francophonie, announced that the timeline for individual charitable donations to be counted toward the government's Syria Emergency Relief Fund would be extended until **February 29, 2016.** For every eligible dollar donated by individual Canadians to registered Canadian charities in response to the conflict in Syria, the government will continue to set aside one dollar—up to a total of \$100 million—to the Fund. **The following procedures are required for funds to be eligible for government matching**. <u>Donations</u> must be:

Here are four things you can do—that anybody can do—to grow closer to Jesus.

• Tell Jesus today and every day that you will do what he wants you to do, say what he wants to you to say, and go where he wants you to go. This is what St. John of the Cross called the Nothing Doctrine: nothing comes before Jesus.

• On your way to Mass, and again just before the Scripture readings, ask the Holy Spirit to enlighten

your heart and mind through the readings. Pay attention don't let your mind wander (I've been there). Jesus is speaking to you through His Word.

• Pray after Mass. Spend as long as you can after receiving Him, several minutes at least, praying to Jesus. He is in you. Ask Him what he wants for you. Listen.

• Promise yourself that following Jesus completely starts today, starts this year.

Obtaining an Indulgence

All who enter through the Door of Mercy, whether as a group or individually, will receive abundant grace and an opportunity for a fresh encounter with Christ.

The Jubilee year provides for the faithful - living and deceased - a plenary indulgence, under the usual conditions:

- Confession within 8 days
- Celebration of Holy Eucharist with reception of Holy Communion
- Praying the Creed and the Lord's Prayer
- Prayer for the Holy Father and his intentions, for the good of the Church and the entire world
- Praying the Jubilee of Mercy Prayer
- Invoking the Divine Mercy, "Jesus, I trust in You"

Year of Mercy

Commit to memory the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. Use these as an inspiration for your own life of mercy

THE WORKS OF MERCY

The Corporal Works of Mercy

focus on physical needs:

- 1. To feed the hungry
- 2. To give drink to the thirsty
- 3. To clothe the naked
- 4. To shelter the homeless
- 5. To visit the sick
- 6. To visit the imprisoned
- 7. To bury the dead

The Spiritual Works of Mercy

- centre on spiritual and emotional needs:
- 1. To instruct the ignorant
- 2. To counsel the doubtful
- 3. To admonish sinners
- 4. To bear wrongs patiently
- 5. To forgive offences willingly
- 6. To comfort the afflicted
- 7. To pray for the living and the dead

Year of Mercy a Way to be Involved-5

Undertake a "Jubilee Year of Mercy" pilgrimage through the doors taking advantage of the opportunity to acquire a Plenary Indulgence. Try randomly selecting one each week and putting it into practice:

18) Offer to run an errand (groceries, dry cleaning pick-up, dog-walking) for a busy parent or homebound person.

19) If you can't sit down beside a homeless person to talk for a while today, at least send a donation to a ministry that does do this.

20) If you're sharing a treat, take the smaller portion.

21) Memorize the 14 corporal and spiritual works of mercy and show your children what they mean.

22) Instead of losing patience with someone online (or in person), try to hear that person's fear. Ask God for what Solomon asked for: "an understanding heart."

Lent is about conversion, turning our lives more completely over to Christ and his way of life. That always involves giving up sin in some form. The goal is not just to abstain from sin for the duration of Lent but to root sin out of our lives forever. Conversion means leaving behind an old way of living and acting in order to embrace new life in Christ.

Year of Mercy – a Way to be Involved - 6

When you pray through the Sunday scriptures, ask God that the power of his mercy may come in your personal and community life. Here are 8 additional ways to live mercy during the Jubilee Year. Try randomly selecting one each week and putting it into practice:

23) Offer to drive an elderly person to Mass.

24) Recall a time you were not given the benefit of the doubt, and extend one to someone else.

25) Put down the phone and really listen to someone else with eye contact.

26) Have alternative drinks, other than water, for times when those who have been struggling with alcohol come to visit.

27) Take advantage of sales to buy small toothpastes, soaps, shampoos, socks and feminine products/toiletries; donate them to parish outreaches or make gift bags and have them ready to hand out where needed.

28) Create a short end-of-day ritual to ask for (and extend) forgiveness with those you live with. "Do not let the sun set on your anger" (Eph. 4:26).

29) Make a list of your "enemies." Then, every day, say a prayer for them.

30) Make a point to smile, greet or make conversation with someone who is not in your everyday circle.

Year of Mercy - a Way to be Involved -- 7

Choose a psalm of mercy for the year and pray it regularly. Here are 6 additional ways to live mercy during the Jubilee Year. Try randomly selecting one each week and putting it into practice: **31**) Give away something of yours (that you really like) to

someone you know would enjoy it.

32) Pray a Divine Mercy Chaplet as you are traveling to or from work.

33) When mercy for others is difficult, pray Cardinal Merry del Val's Litany of Humility.

34) Make a gratitude journal for your spouse and jot down little things he or she does that you're grateful for. Bite your tongue and go write in it (or at least read it) the next time you want to criticize in a moment of frustration.

35) Learn to make an Ignatian "Examen" every night.Remembering God's mercy each night helps us be merciful.36) Respond to provocation with the respect

Working to end inequality in Paraguay, this week our pilgrimage travels to Paraguay where we meet Liz Benitez. Her country is one where 1% of the landowners hold 77% of arable land. Liz's family are part of a peasant movement supported by Development and Peace who work to gain access to land for the poorest farmers in the country, the campesinos. They have been threatened by the state and police because of their work. "I just want to live peacefully with my family," she says.
