#### **Year of Mercy**

In this Year of Mercy, Pope Francis encourages us to show God's mercy through our witness. The Holy Father called this Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy to direct our attention and actions "on mercy so that we may become a more effective sign of the Father's actions in our lives . . . a time when the witness of believers might grow stronger and more effective."

**Our faith** story is our account of God's mercy in our lives. We all have a unique faith story to tell. Sharing God's actions in our lives is the best way to become an effective witness.

**Our baptism** began our faith story. We were commissioned to evangelize. We can fulfill our call to mercy and evangelization in part by sharing our faith story at every opportunity given us by God. Throughout our faith story we tell of God's mercy, his

salvation, redemption and transformation of our lives. God expresses his love through our story. He created each of us as an unrepeatable expression of his presence. He builds our faith each time we encounter him. Each time we tell our story, we reveal a unique expression of God's presence. We share his love and mercy.

Here are five tips for making our witness better in 2016, based on 1 Peter 3:15: Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence.

- **1.** Always be ready and willing to share what God is doing in your life. Know your faith story. Be attentive to the nudge of the Holy Spirit to share with an old friend or someone new in your life.
- **2. Always be** curious about the faith story of those around you and gently encourage them to share their story with you. Approach with admiration that friend you have known for years but whose story you have never heard.
- **3. Always be** authentic. Keep in mind that your witness is not just what you say, but how you live out your faith and demonstrate the reason for your hope. Be approachable.
- **4. Always be** open to receive the grace of the moment, the gift of God's presence. Then be open to giving away that gift of God's presence in you to others. Let a little of your faith story leak out to those around you and see what happens next.
- **5. Always be** humble and seek continuous conversion. Look for ways to renew your faith. Be the one who invites those on the fringes of the church to go with you to a retreat, day of renewal, Bible Study or evangelization seminar. How do I start evangelizing by sharing my faith story? How do I know what to say? Begin journaling. Keep a spiritual journal with all the

blessings the Lord has given you. Ponder the high and low points of your life, praying and listening to the Holy Spirit. Knowing and pondering our faith story helps clarify our thoughts. We see how God intervened and steered us to the path he planned for our greatest happiness. We see his mercy. Start now with your spiritual journal. Let the Holy Spirit remind you of the marvelous blessings God has brought in your life.

#### Christ is really present in the Eucharist

The Catholic doctrine of the Real Presence is the belief that Jesus Christ is literally, not symbolically, present in the Holy Eucharist—body, blood, soul and divinity. Catholics believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist because Jesus tells us this is true in the Bible: "I am the bread of life. [...] I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh. The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' So Jesus said to them,

"Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you; he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day. For my flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him" (John 6:48-56). Furthermore, the early Church Fathers either imply or directly state that the bread and wine offered in the celebration of the Lord's Supper is really the body and blood of Jesus Christ. In other words, the doctrine of the Real Presence that Catholics believe today was believed by the earliest Christians 2,000 years ago! This miracle of God's physical presence to us at every Mass is the truest testament to Christ's love for us and His desire for each of us to have a personal relationship with Him.

#### Churches BC Taxed in 1911 (A historical article)

There is always consolation in the fact that justice will always triumph. The Catholics in BC faced tax burdens in 1911 that were eventually removed – after a long struggle. In 1911 the municipalities of BC adopted the "Single Tax" by which taxes were imposed on the land only. The former Municipal Act had exempted churches from taxation, but the new Act ignored the plight of the churches. In consequence churches suddenly found themselves having to bear an impossible burden. Thus St. Andrew's Cathedral was taxed to the extent of \$8,000.00 in 1913, largely because it was located in the very centre of the city.

After a fruitless appeal to the Provincial Parliament for relief by legislation, it was decided to test in the Law Courts whether the words "building set apart and in use for the public worship of God" in the Municipal Act were not intended to include the site of the church and so grant complete exemption from taxation. Bishop MacDonald therefore formally applied for an injunction to prevent the City of Victoria from selling St. Andrew's Cathedral for taxes on the ground that the taxes were illegally imposed. In return the City of Victoria sued the Bishop personally for the amount of unpaid taxes The amount named in the suit was \$15, 934.44. At the first hearing before Mr. Justice D.A. McDonald on September 4, 1919, with Mr. F.A. McDiarmid appearing for the Bishop, judgment was handed down in favour of the City.

The Bishop appealed and the case was argued before the Appeal Court of British Columbia in Vancouver on April 7, 1920. Chief Justice W.A. MacDonald sustained the lower court, but Justices Archer Martin and A.E. McPhillips reversed the judgment so that the Bishop was sustained by the Appeal Court of the Province. The City, however, was still not satisfied. It applied for permission to appeal directly to the Privy Council in London on the grounds that there were so many Roman Catholic Judges on the bench of the Supreme Court of Canada that the case would not have a fair hearing. The case was argued before the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council on August 1, 1921.

The Judges were Viscount Cave and Lords Dunedin, Atkinson, Shaw and Phillimore; Sir John

Simon appeared for Bishop MacDonald assisted by Mr. F.A. McDiarmid. The judgment, delivered by Lord Atkinson, completely sustained the Appeal Court of British Columbia in favour of the Bishop and thus settled the question. By this judgment all churches in British Columbia were relieved of a crushing burden, which, if it had not been removed, would have paralyzed church work in the Province.

#### Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. What do we believe about the Eucharist? Here are some key points:

\*\*The Eucharist is Christ himself, the Bridegroom of his Spouse, the Church

\*\*Through the Mass, in which the Eucharist is consecrated (the technical term is "confected"), time and space are mysteriously "opened" and the Last Supper and the Passion of Christ become present

\*\*Through the Eucharist, Christ becomes physically present in the Church, keeping his promise that he would always be with us. And because the Eucharist is preserved in the Tabernacle, we can be with him anytime we want. In the Eucharist, we eat the Body and drink the Blood of Christ in Holy Communion, and obtain everlasting life \*\*To receive the Eucharist worthily, one must be a baptized Catholic in a state of grace, understand what one is about to receive, and have kept the Eucharistic fast

\*\*Some of the effects of a worthy reception of the Eucharist are intimate communion with Christ, deeper union with the Body of Christ, forgiveness of venial sins, and an increase in graces and virtues in the soul \*\*The Church reserves Consecrated Hosts in the Tabernacle so that the Eucharist can be brought to the sick and so that the faithful can worship the Blessed Sacrament outside of Mass
