Extra-Ordinary Form of the Mass

On **Sat., June 24th** at **11am** at **St. Andrew's Cathedral** we will have an Extra-Ordinary Form of the Mass celebration for the Solemnity of St. John the Baptist. Extra-ordinary refers to the fact that it will be the Mass Ritual as mandated in 1962 and not the Ordinary Mass, which is what we normally celebrate in our parish Churches. The **Mass will be in Latin and celebrated by Fr. Pablo Santa Maria Watson from Vancouver** and at this time it is not known if this will be a Sung Mass or a Solemn Sung Mass. The music will be under the direction of Michael Gormley and will be sung by the CapriCCio Vocal Ensemble. They will sing Palestrina's Mass Aeterna Christi munera. This Mass will replace the usual 9:30 am Mass at the cathedral on that day. Those who normally are prepared to receive Holy Communion at Holy Mass will also be invited to Communion that day although, in the Extra-Ordinary Form of the Mass, Holy Communion is received on the tongue while kneeling. This celebration of the Extra-Ordinary Form of the Mass is done in the context of the Cathedral's 125th anniversary celebrations. The last time such a Mass was celebrated at the Cathedral was in February 1973 by Bishop Remi de Roo.

The Bishops of Canada have announced that they individually will consecrate Canada to our Lady on July 1st and that this will also be done collectively during their annual meeting in September.

Bishop Gary further explains that in “the teachings of the Second Vatican Council, the Blessed Mother shines forth as “the perfect example, icon, and model of what it means to live by faith,” and by imploring Our Lady’s help, “we welcome with joy and enthusiasm the joys of discipleship in the work of the New Evangelization, ” Let us, in one heart, mind, and spirit, consecrate Canada to our Blessed Mother, who with our Patron, St. Joseph, and our Lord Jesus Christ; the Holy Family, will watch over, guide, bless, and protect our country and its people for millennia to come.

Bishop Gary will be at Notre Dame Parish in Port Alberni on this occasion and will consecrate the diocese from that location on July 1st but he has asked all the pastors to also offer the consecratory prayer (adapted) on July 1st as well.

The consecration will take place here on Sat. at the 5 pm Mass.

What is a Marian consecration and why consecrate Canada to Our Lady?

Q 1. In what way are we already consecrated to God? Through the gift of Baptism, we are reborn, both spiritually and sacramentally, and become children of God. The other Sacraments of Christian Initiation, Confirmation and the Eucharist, strengthen and nourish our life of faith, leading us into an even deeper relationship with Christ through his grace. Through each of these Sacraments, we experience the joy of living as sons and daughters dedicated to the Lord, sharing in his divine life, joining ourselves to his Passion, Death, and Resurrection, and receiving the free and empowering help that God gives us to respond to his call to become disciples, temples of the Holy Spirit, and members of his Church.¹

As baptized persons, young and old, we are called to follow Christ through a life of holiness and service, to witness and evangelize, spreading the Kingdom of God in our midst. When we strive to follow Christ, despite our personal and communal weaknesses and failings, we embody more fully our vocation as “a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s own people” (1 Peter 2:9). Informed and motivated thus by our Godgiven identity, as Christians we look daily to the teachings of Christ

and his Church to shape how we think, decide, and act. It is not easy to respond to life’s challenges and trials in a manner which is coherent and deeply faithful to Christ. With the unfailing help of the Holy Spirit, however, we can turn to the Father for divine assistance, not only at the crossroads of our life, but at every moment.

The first and foremost way of understanding what consecration means comes from the viewpoint of God himself, for it is he who consecrates us before all else. Through Baptism, God makes us his adoptive children and confers on us his very own holiness of life and love. With God’s sanctifying and healing grace, we are made partakers of his Trinitarian life, enabling us to believe in him, to hope in him, and to love him through the theological virtues; we live and act under the promptings and with the gifts of the Holy Spirit; we grow in goodness through the moral virtues.²

A second, complementary way of understanding consecration is from the viewpoint of our human and Christian experience. Living in holiness and truth, we share in God’s life and love.

To consecrate ourselves to him personally, then, is to make a faith-filled decision in which our response to God’s love for us is uniquely our own. A personal act of consecration is a means of further appropriating our Christian calling and continuing to abide in God’s grace. It is the renewal of our first consecration at Baptism in the particular form of a personal pledge, made willingly in faith, to live in more profound communion with Our Lord, committing ourselves to him and his Kingdom with greater fervour. It is an entrustment of our entire being to God, including all that we are and do, that we may belong to him more fully and to open ourselves even more to his grace in our lives. Christ Jesus is the best and prime example of what it means to consecrate oneself to God and to his will.

Appeal in response to famines in South Sudan and extreme food shortages in Yemen, northeast Nigeria and Somalia

(CCCB – Ottawa)... The Most Reverend Douglas Crosby, O.M.I., Bishop of Hamilton and President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), has joined other Christian, Jewish, Muslim, Sikh, and Bahá'í faith leaders in Canada in launching a national appeal to help address the famines in South Sudan and the extreme food shortages in Yemen, northeast Nigeria and Somalia. Each of the participating faith communities is mobilizing in response to "one of the world's largest humanitarian crises since the Second World War: the grim reality of multiple famines occurring simultaneously in four separate countries."

In February 2017, the United Nations declared there are 20 million people, including 1.4 million vulnerable children, at risk of death over the coming months in these four countries. This crisis results from ongoing armed conflicts and severe droughts, with hundreds of thousands of people being displaced from their homes and land. According to the UN, the crisis far exceeds the current availability of resources and the amount of funding committed so far by the international community.

The religious leaders' "unified cry from the heart" calls for a threefold response from their faithful: Pray: To remember the people of South Sudan, Somalia, northern Nigeria and Yemen in their personal and community prayer, and to pray also for peace, for government leaders and for humanitarian workers in the region.

Give: To make a financial contribution to one or more of the various reputable Canadian aid agencies working to alleviate this crisis. Contributions made to a recognized Canadian charity between 17 March to 30 June, 2017 will be matched by the Government of Canada with its recently announced "Famine Relief Fund".

Speak out: To take the time to become better informed about the crisis in the four countries; to speak about it with family, friends and neighbours; to discuss it with local community agencies; and to contact Members of Parliament.

The religious leaders unequivocally single out the protracted violence in South Sudan, Somalia, Nigeria and Yemen as the leading cause of the humanitarian crisis, insisting: "Our federal government has made known its intention to participate more fully at the UN Security Council in the coming years. Now is the moment for our Prime Minister and all Canadian leaders to live up to that aspiration by speaking out clearly and consistently to end the violence taking place in South Sudan, Somalia, Nigeria and Yemen [...] Canada's voice must be heard in

this dire moment, especially as it celebrates 150 years of Confederation."

In addition to the joint appeal by the religious leaders, the CCCB has circulated to the Catholic Bishops of Canada and also published on its own website suggested Prayers of the Faithful relating to the crisis, which can be adapted, and a factsheet outlining the dire humanitarian dimension of the situation.

Catholic parishes across the country are organizing special collections, and many are expected to plan efforts to respond to this appeal, this June.
