Sacramental Information

Baptism: at Our Lady Queen of Peace you must call the office at least 3 months in advance to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. It is assumed that the family has Our Lady Queen of Peace parish connection and practices the faith by attending Sunday Mass on a weekly basis. You may meet with the Pastor and take the course even if your child has not yet been born. Parents are expected to participate in the Baptismal preparation. At least one Godparent or both must be baptized and confirmed and are practicing Catholics. Non-parishioners are required to have a Letter of Recommendation from your Pastor to have your child Baptized in our parish.

Marriage: at Our Lady Queen of Peace because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

<u>Funeral:</u> at Our Lady Queen of Peace individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

The President of the National Council of Development and Peace, Evelyne Beaudoin, and Nancy Stuart from our Diocese who is a National Council Member for British Columbia/Yukon have both assured me that the monies collected will only go to member-partners aligned with the teachings and the ethical and moral standards of the Catholic Church.

Development and Peace - Share the Journey

Share Lent comes to us on the 5th Sunday of Lent. This is a collection that aids the endeavours of Development and Peace Caritas Canada in the global south. D & P has a unique plan. It never fully funds a project – it joins with other organizations to make a bigger difference and to ensure that funding comes from many sources. It also makes its decisions on funding by holding dialogues with the people of the area to find out what **they** think are their most urgent needs long term and short. Of course it is there for disaster relief – entering the fray through its connections that are already in the region, especially Caritas Internationalis.

Development and Peace works with other organizations to provide basic food, clean water and shelter, but they also combine efforts to teach the people there how to help each other out and promote an atmosphere of peace in which to live with others in close confinement and fear. They bring hope with communication. Australia: Pope appoints New Head of Personal Ordinariate. Pope Francis on March 26, 2019, appointed Canadian priest Fr. Carl Reid the second Ordinary of the Personal Ordinariate of 'Our Lady of the Southern Cross' – a role he will take up in August.

Monsignor Carl Reid grew up in the Anglican Church of Canada before going on to serve as a deacon, minister and suffragan bishop in the Anglican Catholic Church in Canada. He was later received into full communion with the Catholic Church and was ordained a Catholic priest in January 2013.

"The Personal Ordinariate is a blessing to the whole Church in Australia and we look forward to welcoming Msgr. Carl later this year, including as a member of the Bishops Conference," Archbishop Coleridge said.

Msgr. Reid said "Although he had expected his current role in British Columbia would be his last, Msgr. Reid had "pledged to serve Mother Church in whatever capacity deemed appropriate, so we are looking forward to the challenge". Beyond the practical planning that is required, Msgr. Reid said the months between now and his installation at St. Mary's Cathedral in Sydney on Aug. 27 would also involve "prayer that I will be faithful to this particular calling".
